News from Mulanje

Once again, greetings from Mulanje.

The floods in January and February brought with them many challenges – houses washed away, some local churches washed away, many many toilets washed away, and crops destroyed. We have seen more patients with malaria and diaarhoeal diseases than usual because of the floods, and MMH has been very busy.

Our partners and supporters reacted to our appeal for help with the reconstruction of toilets with amazing generosity – so far we have assisted villages to rebuild more than 2000 toilets, and the target set by MMH, of 3000, will undoubtedly be reached. Vital work for the prevention of diarrhoeal diseases in our community.

We continue to see the effects of the floods on food supplies, with many younger children presenting at the hospital with malnutrition. Our nutrition rehabilitation unit monitors the growth of children and gives likuni phala to both children and adults in need. Importantly, the NRU also provides training for the community on home gardening, modern farming practices, pig keeping and dairy goat rearing - so important in developing sustainable approaches to improved nutrition. With assistance from the Scottish Govt through Edinburgh Medical Missionary Society we have also renovated an old isolation ward to be used in the event of an outbreak of cholera.

We have exciting plans for the next few months, starting with a mission-wide celebration next Saturday – it will be 125 years since the foundation of Mulanje Mission. We will welcome several church partners visiting here on the day – from Scotland, Belfast and Pittsburg USA. There will be a service on the football field at 9am, followed by singing, dancing and a shared lunch.

The hospital will be embarking on some new projects too, renovating our septic tanks and sewer system, and rebuilding the antenatal ward area. Lots to do!
